

- To promote learning and knowledge exchange amongst Diaspora Organizations and communities
- To provide a platform to discuss and consult with Diaspora Organizations in six continents on the challenges their diaspora communities are facing and
- To unite for progress and call for continuous global diaspora engagement that contributes to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).



About GDC

The Global Diaspora Confederation (GDC) is the world's largest diaspora-led civil society organization that aims to unify, support, develop and promote Diaspora Organizations across the world to achieve peace, unity, and social and economic advancement for all.

The GDC was founded in July 2020, after it convened 231 Diaspora Organizations from over 100 countries to issue a joint statement in solidarity with diaspora communities across the world who had been

disproportionately affected by the pandemic, experiencing a rise in xenophobia caused by it.

The GDC is supported by the UN International Organization for Migration (IOM). It has since been progressing significantly with plans to expand its network, to facilitate stronger collaborations with diaspora partners to mobilize resources and to launch a platform for global online consultations with Diaspora Organizations across the world.



The purpose of the Global Diaspora Week is to bring Diaspora Organizations together, create unity through diversity, give voice to Diaspora Organizations to advocate for small communities by letting them be heard by many diaspora partners, governments, and intergovernmental organizations in the world. We invite all Diaspora Organizations to join us to discuss, debate and make recommendations on subjects pertaining to diaspora and their supporting communities.

This is a key moment to mark the global cohesion Diaspora Organizations have been building to date. It is also a celebratory moment to recognize importance of Diaspora Organizations that haveadvocated for their diasporas over the centuries.
